*Since September 11, 2001 counter-terrorism efforts have increasingly informed immigration policy and have institutionalized discrimination against immigrants perceived to be Muslim on the basis of their name or national origin. A substantial expansion of name-check procedures has illegally delayed the processing of thousands of citizenship applications from Muslim, South Asian, Middle Eastern, and Arab men. This counter-terrorism dragnet is breaking up families, engendering fear and insecurity, and disenfranchising entire communities.*
