NYU School of Law will select one team of three law students to compete in the Jean-Pictet Competition which is expected to occur in March 2012. It will be the responsibility of the NYU Team to apply for admission to the Competition; apply for funding (expected to be available from the Hauser Global Law School Program); prepare for the Competition; and otherwise organize itself.

Students should consult the Competition website before completing this application; please include only information relevant to the Competition in the application. See http://www.concourspictet.org/index_en.htm. It should be noted that selection for the NYU Team does not guarantee participation in the Competition; the Team must complete a separate, substantive application for submission to the Pictet organizers, who ultimately decide which teams are invited to compete.

Students wishing to be considered for inclusion on the NYU team should complete the attached application cover sheet with relevant documents, and e-mail a complete copy in one PDF document to tish.armstrong@nyu.edu by **12 noon on Monday, September 26. (Please put "Jean-Pictet NYU Team Application" in the subject line.)** Late applications will not be accepted.

After a review of the applications, finalists will be selected and interviewed during the week of October 3, with selection of the members of the NYU Team thereafter.

4. List of relevant activities: please list relevant activities (including moot court competitions, arbitration or mediation competitions, activities involving international humanitarian law, public speaking experience, teamwork, and any other experience you feel may be relevant). Include in this list the institutions where the activities took place, and any relevant results, grades, or awards. This list should be *concise* and related to the skills needed for the competition.
5. Statement of interest: Please write a *brief* statement of interest, not to exceed 500 words on one page.
